

Achievement

Nationally, all 11 year old children are assessed in Reading, Writing and Maths during their last year at primary school. In 2016, national tests were reported as scaled scores where 100 represents the expected standard, and 110 represents a high standard. For writing and science, teacher assessments are used. Here is how many of our children reach the nationally expected standard in all three subjects:



Here's how many of our children exceed or do better than the nationally expected level ("working at greater depth within the expected standard") in all three subjects:

Progress

The national average for progress is zero. Anything above zero is therefore better than average. Children in Brindishe Schools make above average progress in Reading, Writing and Maths, as shown in the graph below.



Average scaled score

Children are awarded a scaled score between 80 and 120 with 100 being the expected standard. On average, children at Brindishe Schools perform better than the national expectation in all three subjects:

Together we share...

As nationally recognised outstanding schools, we are invited (and expected) to share our good practice and support other schools.

We do this in Lewisham, across London and beyond. In the last year we have supported around 30 schools by visiting them and welcoming over 100 visiting teachers and school leaders from Lincoln to Penzance!

Together we are more - Celebrating across our schools ...

- Brindishe children experienced more than 300 opportunities to take learning beyond the classroom including at the Transport Museum, the Golden Hinde, the British Museum, Tate Modern, the National Portrait Gallery, the beach, London Zoo, Kew Gardens, Chislehurst Caves, wading in Deptford Creek, at places of worship, at Hampton Court. They took part in Google virtual reality expeditions and residential visits to Marchants Hill and the Isle of Wight.
- Brindishe children continued to compete and to win trophies across the field, including for athletics, tag rugby, hockey and netball. They had cycle training with Bikeability, learned to swim, represented their schools in swimming galas and competed in a tri-school Ancient Olympic Games at Ladywell Arena and many children took part in 'Together We Run' our annual tri-school fun run.
- Brindishe children performed 'Twelfth Night' at Greenwich Theatre in front of an audience of over 400 as part of the Shakespeare Schools' Festival. They sang at Blackheath Halls and performed as a massed choir - the largest school concert in the world - at the O2 arena and they danced on (Catford!) Broadway. They worked with the London Symphony Orchestra at the Barbican and experienced live music performances including Trinity Laban's Brass Quintet.
- Brindishe children proudly celebrated our diverse community, challenging stereotypes and assumptions through day to day learning; they grew, cooked and ate their own vegetables, cared for chickens and hatched their eggs, became leaders of learning including being Digital Leaders. They established a debating society, raised over £2500 for Crisis, gathered food for Lewisham Foodbanks and interviewed both Lewisham's Young Mayor and Mayor ... all part of the Brindishe Schools' experience.
