Every single one of the children on our team were fantastic - they supported each other, were very patient and showed excellent sportsmanship, especially those children who did not win their races.

A special well done to Ann-Marie who won the 400m, Katelle who won the 100m, Bianca who won the 400m - it was literally a photograph finish between Bianca & Katelle - to the Year 5/6 100m relay team and to Ornella for winning the 800m race and the long jump.

Even though these children won, each and everyone one of you there played your part. You really were fantastic and made Mr Hughes, Miss Parker and Mr Phipps very proud indeed.
