This week's learning at Brindishe Lee...

We made a real working wind turbine! We got a battery compartment and used plastic blocks to make a circuit. We also made pylons to carry electricity to houses! It's a clean energy unlike coal.

Reception

This week, in maths, we've been using deines to do column addition and started looking at tricky plurals like 'y' becoming 'ies' as in 'fly' and 'flies' in phonics.

Year 2

In science, we separated a mixture of water, sugar and sand. We filtered out the sand and left the water to evaporate leaving sugar. We also did acute, obtuse and reflex angles.

Year 5 Willow We've used number lines
to do subtraction and have
been researching plants by
taking pictures of
different parts of a plant.
We also did a Y2 maths
challenge for our early
morning learning!

Year 1 Magnolia

Carrying on with
Egyptians, we took selfportraits on the iPads and
changed our features to
make us look like we lived
in Egypt. Some were
creepy and over-the-top!

Year 3

We're continuing with *The*Lost Thing and are writing alternative endings. We've also started Italian! Did you know that a 'c' is pronounced ch: 'ciao', and a 'ch' is a k: 'chianti'.

Year 5 Cherry We're looking at an artist called Georgia O'Keefe who showed how she was feeling using colours. So we're doing detailed sketches of flowers and colouring them with how we feel.

Year 1 Sycamore

We went on a school trip to a Roman villa where an archaeologist explained the Roman history around us. There was a fun mosaic by numbers which was a highlight.

We've been very busy rehearsing our end of school performances. We also learnt how to calculate the circumference of a circle: pi times by its diameter or twice its radius.
