Next week our assemblies and class discussions will be focused on **Article 29**

Your education should help you use and develop your talents and abilities. It should also help you learn to live peacefully, protect the environment and respect other people.

03 July is **International Plastic Bag Free Day**.

This is a unique opportunity to spread the word that a plastic bag free world is possible and that sound environmental alternatives to single use plastics are available. We would also like to take this opportunity to encourage children to **bring into school a reusable bottle to fill with water**, instead of a disposable plastic one. 'Water bottles now make up around half of all plastic bottles. To reduce the **7.7 billion plastic water bottles** used each year in the UK, a culture of carrying a reusable bottle should be embedded through the provision of public water fountains and access to free tap water' (Environmental Audit Committee). All classrooms in Brindishe Lee have access to drinking water, water is available at lunchtime and there are a number of water fountains in the playground.

This week's learning at Brindishe Lee!

We've been going to the front of the school everyday to take a tally of the bikes and scooters. We want to encourage people to come to school in a way that makes the environment better.

Reception

We've been learning about water pollution. Litter like plastic bottles and crisp packets get in the ocean and can make animals poorly or die from eating it! We must all use less plastic if we can.

Year 1
Magnolia

We learnt about woodland conservation which is about trees being knocked down and how trees can actually stop air pollution. We also learnt about the value of coins and notes in maths.

Sycamore

Looking at Georgia O'Keeffe, we used watercolours to extend a wave pattern that we placed in the centre of our canvas. We even worked with Year 6!

Year 2

Using PicCollage, we've made posters about allergies and consequences using phrases like 'If you don't... you will...'. We're also planting beans in different areas.
