### Start of Spring Term - School Operation, January 5<sup>th</sup>

School will be open for all pupils, under current Covid risk assessments, on **Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> January 2022**.

We will be monitoring the guidance over the next few weeks and if any sudden changes are to happen we will update all parents/carers via **WEDUC or the school website** by 10am on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> January.

Schools have always heard government announcements at the same time as everyone else, and therefore we will endeavour to provide you with all the information you need as soon as possible. Please avoid calling the school office for information until we have shared what we know with you on Weduc.

### Travel over the Winter Break

We would also like to remind our families that if you are travelling abroad over the festive period, please ensure you are clear on the travel guidance. Please email the school (using the info@ email address), to let us know of where you have travelled to and of any quarantine restrictions.



### Close Contact of a Positive Case

Government Guidance from Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> December states that **everyone over the age of 5, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take a lateral flow (LFD) test every day for 7 days**, instead of self-isolating.

Daily testing by close contacts will help to slow the spread of COVID-19. **If you or your child shows any Covid19 symptoms, please take a PCR test** – children should not return to school until they have had a negative result. Many thanks.
