Dear parents, carers, staff, governors and friends.

"Ms Gorbutt you are a legend – I knew you'd make it happen"

These are the words of a Brindishe Green parent and he sent them to Sarah Gorbutt recently when she made sure that his daughter had the opportunity to take part in something she really wanted to do but might not otherwise have had the chance.

It was a fitting tribute, born of appreciation – and it illustrates exactly what Ms Gorbutt has done over the past 11 years at Brindishe Green – made things that were previously thought impossible happen for children just as they should. For her, there must be no barriers to children being able to take part, to succeed and to achieve.

This is Ms Gorbutt's last week in Brindishe Green and I know that many of you will want to say your farewells and to thank her for her work at and on behalf of the school which under her leadership has been transformed.

In 2007 the school, then known as Hither Green, was half empty, had gone through 5 headteachers in as many years and was the lowest achieving school in Lewisham. It was a very sad and troubled place with a dreary curriculum and not a trophy or cup to its name. It now holds its head high and is one of the largest, most successful and creative schools in London and its trophy cabinet, as you may know, is full of prizes and accolades for sport, art, inclusion, science and more.

It is now recognised as one of the Mayor of London's 'Schools for Success' and will be honoured again in October under the strapline of "Being disadvantaged is not a disadvantage at Brindishe Green," as our performance data shows that children here succeed equally well regardless of their circumstances.



Ms Gorbutt must be rightly proud of her achievements; she has been and always will be an outstanding teacher and headteacher. Her colleagues, her families, her community and children will miss her enormously as she sets off to enjoy a different kind (and pace!) of life nearer the coast.

Her influence in shaping the future of Brindishe Green and building the partnership of Brindishe Schools has been significant and I am certain that without her we would not have our very successful federation of three great schools. We all wish her well and thank her from the bottom of our hearts. I know that she will keep in touch and that everyone at Brindishe Green will make sure that her legacy of tolerance, warmth, good humour and a genuine desire to make the impossible possible will live on in Brindishe.



As we near the end of the academic year we also take this opportunity to say good bye and thank you to several of our Brindishe Governors who are now stepping down as they come to the end of their terms of office.

Most significantly we say goodbye to Spyros Elia our Chair of Governors who leaves Brindishe after being part of our schools for over 30 years and 25 of them as a governor. Spyros first became a governor in 1992 and in his time has served as a parent, co-opted and local authority governor. For the majority of his time as a governor he has been unanimously elected to be

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Chair, a role to which he has given care, clarity, intelligence and wisdom.

Spyros was part of the group who first supported and brokered the partnership between Brindishe and Hither Green Schools, and then Brindishe and Lee Manor Schools to help us become one of the first, strongest and most successful and lasting genuine partnerships in primary education.

His contribution to Brindishe, to education, to our community and to Lewisham is rightly locally and nationally recognised and is immeasurable. We wish him well.

We also say goodbye to Nasrin Tarafder Rashid who was elected as a parent governor at Brindishe and then co-opted to be a governor at Hither Green as we began our partnership. Nasrin has given over ten years of her time, care and attention to making sure we get it right for our communities and that we think about the needs of all children and all families in our work together.

We thank also our elected parent governors Sarah Clayton and Fahmida Din, and Katie Matthews our elected staff governor for their hard work and commitment over four years of office with us; time and energy given freely and willingly and all towards making sure our schools are successful.

I am pleased to let you know that some of our experienced governors are remaining on the governing body: Lindsay Dale is the newly elected Chair from 31 August 2018; Jackie Stirling will remain as vice chair (and for her 26th year as a governor); Liz Murphy, Haydn Phillips and John Myers will also remain and elections for new governors will follow in September.

For now we say goodbye to Spyros, Nasrin, Sarah, Fahmida and Katie – and a thousand thanks on behalf of everyone in our community. To all of our governors we say thank you for their voluntary but invaluable work this year, and for most of the governors, year after year after year, for Brindishe.
