Online Safety Bulletin - Being Kind

We talk to our children about being kind all the time. We encourage them to share their toys and use good manners, but how often do we discuss being kind online too? Their digital lives are as important to our children as their offline relationships, so it is important that we teach them how to be kind online too.

- Remind your child that whenever they post, comment or speak online, they should always think about how it might make other people feel.
- Talk about what a good friend would do if someone were being mean to their friend. For example: not join in and check that their friend is OK. They should tell a trusted adult if they are worried about their friend.
- We should have consent before sharing pictures or videos of others. Let your child know that being kind to others online means respecting them and thinking about the consequences of sharing something that involves someone else.

This week's article for you to talk about with your family is...



Article 32 – Protection from Harmful Work:

Governments must protect children from economic exploitation and work that is dangerous or might harm their health, development or education. Governments must set a minimum age for children to work and ensure that work conditions are safe and appropriate.

We teach our children the importance of a good education and that it is their Right to come to school. We also teach our children that no child should do a job that is dangerous or gets in the way of their education and wellbeing.

Cards for children and tokens of appreciation for staff

This year, we kindly ask that children **do not** bring cards or gifts into school for children in their class/bubble. This is because we want to reduce the amount of paper coming into school and going home again. If children bring cards into school they will gently be asked to take them home again and to exchange them outside of school.

We have been asked this week by a few parents and carers about whether they can bring in a token of appreciation to a staff member towards the end of this Autumn term. Whilst we certainly <u>do not expect any gifts</u> from our families, should you wish to send a staff member in school a card or small token of appreciation then this would need to be given by **Monday 14**th **December**, so that the necessary precautions can be taken before staff take them home on Friday 18th December.
