Dear families, governors, neighbours and staff,

This week, almost 100 Year 6 children went on a 5-day residential School Journey, alongside 8 members of staff. After a very, very, very rainy start to the week, the sun came out and they all had a wonderful time pushing themselves to try new activities including The Giant Swing, climbing, shelter building, archery, Jacob's Ladder and obstacle challenges. The children behaved impeccably all week and the adults were very proud of them all. We would like to thank all the staff who accompanied the children, giving up their own time and putting 100% effort into making sure that the children had a wonderful time...it would not have been possible without them.

The remaining Year 6 children who stayed in school also had a great week taking part in a range of creative and fun activities, including making Oreo cheesecakes, photography, DT and Art projects, Coding and daily PE sessions. On Wednesday they went to Hazard House in Lee to learn skills and information that they will need to keep themselves safe out in the community and as they become more independent.

Next week is a busy week in school. The teachers from Year 1 to 6 will be looking at the progress the children have made since they started back to school and what skills and knowledge they can remember. This will be through carrying out some informal tests, looking at their books, listening to them read and talking to others. It is nothing for the children (or you) to worry about and will all be carried out as part of normal classroom practice.

Also next week, it is national Anti-Bullying week. The children will be learning what bullying is, what it might look like, and how to speak out safely if they are worried that either they or someone else is being bullied. There is no place for bullying in our school, online, or in the wider community. We want to empower all our children to work together to 'call it out' but reaching out to members of staff or parents/carers, if they are worried or upset. This will lead into Children in Need on Friday, and the following week when we have our Celebrating Diversity week (more information to follow).

Important – No Nuts in School

Please can we remind all families that no nuts, or nut products should be brought into school, as we have several children and staff who have severe allergies.

Please can we ask that there are no nut products in the lunch boxes or brought into the school as a snack. This includes: peanut butter sandwiches, chocolate hazelnut spreads, cereal bars, some granola bars, cakes that contain nuts, biscuits / cookies that contain nuts, peanut butter cakes, some Asian food including satay or other sauces that contain nuts. This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely.

We appreciate that this is an additional thing to check but we know that you recognise the importance of it, especially as this allergy can be a life-threatening condition. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to speak to a member of staff.
