Brindishe Green is taking part in #HelloYellow on 10 October 2022, World Mental Health Day.

The number of young people in need of mental health support is growing faster than ever – with a record breaking 420,000 young people being treated for mental health problems every month. Most young people aren't getting the help they need, and this can't go on.

That's why this year #HelloYellow is more important than ever. We'll be joining thousands of other schools by **wearing yellow** to show young people that how they feel matters, and that they deserve to feel supported.
