End of the School Day

Now that we have had our first full week back at school there are a number of ways, we think will make the end of the day run more smoothly:

- The gate opens at 3.15 and closes at 3.25. This means there is a ten-minute window to come and collect your children. Please do not all feel that you need to be here at 3.15 on the dot.
- Please keep the ramp down to the office free when you arrive so that our home alone children can leave safely and quickly.

• When leaving school, if you are able to, please try and walk down the steps and up the ramp (home alone children will have left at this point) in order to make sure that fewer people are walking in different directions.

Home Alone Children

If you would like your child in Year 5 or 6 to walk home alone, please can you remind them to:

- Walk straight home
- Not to talk to strangers
- Keep their mobile phones in their pocket and not on show
- Stick to the busier, well-lit roads such as Hither Green Lane or Beacon Road. They should avoid Ardmere Cottages or quieter streets

We will only allow your child to walk home alone if you have given permission by emailing the office (info@brindishegreen.lewisham.sch.uk). Please note that it is not possible for the staff to track different arrangements on different days and therefore if you would like your child to walk home alone, we will presume this is every day. If you would like to collect your child, we recommend you arrange this with them before school and meet them on Beacon Road.

We avoid letting younger children walk home with older siblings. They need to be collected by a known adult.

Clothing and Jewellery

Please can we remind all our families and children that although we do not have a compulsory uniform, there are a couple of requirements that form part of our school policy:

- Children should come to school **prepared for the whole day ahead**. Please check the weather to see if they will need a raincoat, a sunhat, a warm jumper etc.
- Children should **not** come to school in a onesie, sleeveless tops with shoulders exposed or tops that show the child's middle.
- Children should wear **trainers**, **shoes or boots**. They should not wear wellington boots, clogs, backless shoes, crocs, shoes with a heel or shoes with toes exposed.
- Children are allowed to wear **a watch or stud earrings only**. They should not wear a bracelet or necklace unless it is for religious purposes such as a Sikh bangle.
- On days your child has PE, they should wear **suitable clothing to move freely in,** including trainers, shorts/jogging bottoms, a t-shirt and a sweatshirt. Children cannot do PE well or safely in jeans or a skirt/dress. Even if it is very cold, children will still do PE outside.

It is unfortunate but sometimes losses occur within school. We take every effort to teach the children how to look after their belongings but you can help us by **labelling all items of clothing and footwear**. Thank you.

Urgent messages need to be communicated by email or phone to the school office. If you would like to contact the class teacher, please email info@brindishegreen.lewisham.sch.uk your message will be passed onto the teacher.

Medicines and Allergies

All medication must come directly to the school office. Children must not carry any medication in their book bag. Staff at Brindishe Green School are unable to give your child medicine unless you complete and sign the 'Request for medication to be administered form' and the Head teacher or Deputy Head teacher agrees that staff may administer the medication.

Please note that only adults with full Parental Responsibility can give permission and sign this form. If you are not sure if you do have Parental Responsibility please do not sign the slip but seek advice from the school office or http://childlawadvice.org.uk/information-pages/parental-responsibility/

Educational Visits - Payment

Once you have logged into the new parent portal, you will be able to make the £20 trip payment (£10 for FSM families). This is the payment we ask parents/carers to pay at the start of the year to support all the trips and experiences that the staff are planning to enhance your child's learning. Please ensure this is paid before half term. Over the coming weeks the teachers will begin to tell you about some of the visits they are organising to support the children with their learning.

School Meals with RADISH

Please note there is a slight increase on school dinners. The new price will be £2.51 per day. £12.55 a week. You will be able to access your dinner money payments through the new parent portal.
