FSM Vouchers for half term October 2022

The London Borough of Lewisham has confirmed that it is able to support families with FSM (Free School Meal) eligible children by providing vouchers for the October (2022) half term. The available funding means they can assist these families at a rate of £15 per eligible child. It is also likely that this will now continue for Christmas which we will confirm in the next few weeks. Families will receive a supermarket voucher provided by an extension to the Household Support Fund via London Borough of Lewisham and your school.

Lewisham has also advised that families with FSM eligible children can also access free meals in the holidays by using the HAF (Holiday Activities and Food) programme. This will be additional to the provision made through vouchers. Lewisham Council is providing a varied holiday programme with funding from the Department of Education.

A wide range of providers in Lewisham are supporting the delivery of this programme, offering various funpacked sessions, including arts and crafts and sports.

There will be free activities and lunches for school-aged children and young people who are aged 4–16 years (reception to year 11) and eligible for and in receipt of benefit-related Free School Meals. Each club will provide:

- a wide range of exciting activities to suit different ages and personalities
- fun physical activity sessions
- free, nutritious and tasty food.

Caribbean Doll Display by Pauline Straker Rodgers

Unit 17, Lewisham Shopping Centre (opposite H & M)

Pauline was born in Kingston Jamaica and is a long term Lewisham resident. In 1997 Pauline came to international attention when she was invited by the Global Doll Society to become one of its speciality teachers—this made her the only GDS teacher recognised in the world of African wigs and costumes and she has since gone on to win prizes for her work. She also volunteers at Lee Seniors Club.

This is a rare opportunity to see some of Pauline's porcelain dolls made with authentic African hair in her home borough.

Lewisham Black History Walks: Blackheath

Queens Walking Group invite you to discover how some of Britain's families made fortunes through enslavement and why Blackheath was central to it. This tour also introduces some of the earliest African writers to be published in English as well as a host of 18th century Black activists, 'princes', scholars and others who defied all the limitations placed against them.

This walk around Blackheath finishes inside Greenwich Park close to the Rose Garden. It is suitable for all ages and levels of mobility, and should last 1.5 hours. **Tickets are free but must be booked here in advance**.

29 October

Lewisham Black History Walks: Deptford

Join Queens Walking Group for this final walking tour which takes you from the living memories of the New Cross Fire, through the area's earliest post-Windrush race riots. a selection of 18th and 19th century Black locals to 1501 and the beginnings of the Black presence in Tudor London. This walk has a special focus on themes of family life and 'repatriation'.

The walk finishes by the Thames at Deptford Steps, Watergate Street. It is suitable for all ages and levels of mobility, and should last 1.5 hours. Tickets are free but must be booked here in advance.

Brindishe Weekly Online Safety Bulletin Omegle



You must be 18+ to use or 13+ with parental permission. Omegle is a social networking/chat website that connects two strangers together for either a text or a video chat.

Chats are anonymous unless a user provides this information. Omegle states that "Omegle video chat is moderated. However, moderation is not perfect. You may still encounter people who misbehave."

What should I be aware of?

- No registration is required to access Omegle (therefore no age verification) and there are no reporting facilities.
- Users are given an option to save the chat's log and share the link. It is also possible for other users to take screenshots of text and video chats.

We recommend that Omegle is not used by children due to the potential imagery shared and language used which can be explicit. You can find out more information from Internet Matters, including ways of keeping your child safe:

Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools - Article of the Week

Article 37 (inhumane treatment and detention)

Children must not be tortured, sentenced to the death penalty or suffer other cruel or degrading treatment or punishment.

Article 40 (juvenile justice)

A child accused or guilty of breaking the law must be treated with dignity and respect.

In all Brindishe Schools we have school class charters based on children's rights. This approach helps children to understand the difference between rights and having school rules. Rights respecting charters can help everyone to get along better.

With your children you could discuss if they have ever done something wrong or had something wrong done to them. What are the different ways you can resolve disagreements and hurtful behaviours?
