If so, you can access the Microsoft Family Safety mobile app, which provides you with a variety of free features including:

- > The ability to set screen time limits to devices, apps and games.
- Set content filters and block inappropriate apps/games.
- > Additional features such as location sharing are available as part of a paid subscription.

Summer Holiday Vouchers

Lewisham Borough has confirmed that The Household Support Fund will continue to support children eligible for free school meals over the summer holidays. The aviable funding will assist these families at a rate of £90 per eligle child for the holiday.

Don't forget that families can also access free meals in the holidays by using the HAF (Holiday Activities and Food) programme. This will be additional to the provision made through vouchers. Vouchers should distributed to all eligible children even if they have a place in the HAF programme.

A wide range of providers in Lewisham are supporting the delivery of the HAF programme, offering various funpacked sessions, including arts and crafts, games, trips, food and sports.

The HAF programme is for Lewisham children and young people in receipt of free school meals to access FREE activities and food, in the core holiday periods, each child or young person is entitled to 16 Hours per week, (4 hours per day, 4 days a week). Providers will ensure to provide children / young people with

- a wide range of exciting activities to suit different ages and personalities
- fun physical activity sessions
- free, nutritious and tasty food

How to book: Parents / carers (in receipt of free school meals) book with the provider directly ~ all contact details can be found on the attached HAF summer programme and will also need the Lewisham code; ACCESS CODE OF LBLSUM23.
