Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools – Article of the week

Article 5 (parental guidance and a child's evolving capacities):

Governments must respect the rights and responsibilities of parents and carers to provide guidance and direction to their child as they grow up, so that they fully enjoy their rights. This must be done in a way that recognises the child's increasing capacity to make their own choices.

Article 18 (parental responsibilities and state assistance):

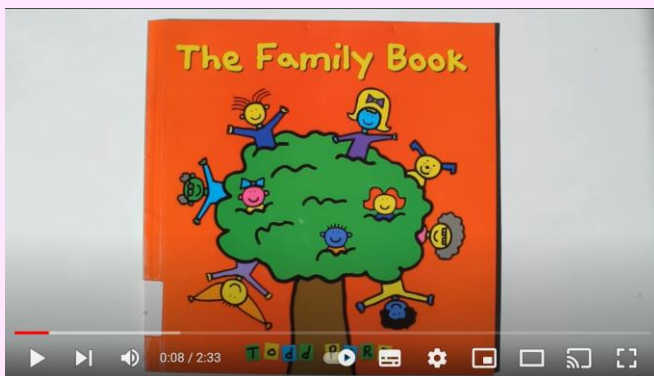
Both parents (or legal guardians) share responsibility for bringing up their child and parents and carers should always consider what is best for the child. Governments must support parents and legal carers by creating support services for children and giving parents the help they need to raise their children.

Articles 5 and 18 are all about the job of parents and carers in the upbringing of children and young people.

What are some of the important things that you do as parents and carers for your children?

- Provide a home.
- Care for your children and show your love.
- Provide food and clothes.
- Set you a good example.
- Help your children to become independent.
- Give emotional support.
- Support learning and going to school.
- Make sure your children have opportunities to be fit and healthy.
- Prepare your children for adult life.
- Share your culture and identity and beliefs and values.
- Allow your child to be themselves.
- Help your children to enjoy all of their rights!

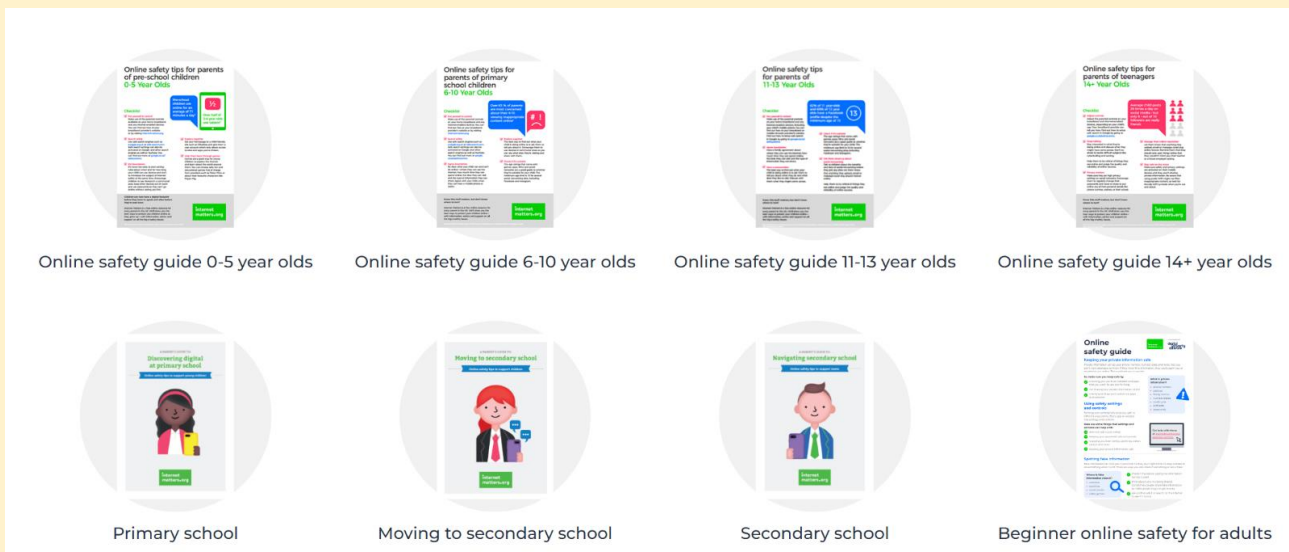
