What has been happening this week?

Welcome back and a happy new year to all our children, families and staff! Everyone has returned to school full of energy and enthusiasm after the long winter break and we have enjoyed hearing about how the children spent time with their family and friends. It is a short half term - only 4 weeks now - and so there is a lot to squeeze in. Fingers crossed the sun will continue to shine, even if it is cold!

What is happening next week?

On Thursday 18th it is Census Day! It is very important that every child is in school on this day. If your child normally has a packed lunch and would like to try a school dinner on this day, we encourage them to do so.

Next week our Year 5 and 6 children will be taking part in workshops and assemblies led by Talk Consent. These are age appropriate sessions which are delivered to teach children about the importance of consent and building safe and healthy relationships, following The Department of Education Guidance. Before the sessions, parents/carers have the opportunity to attend an online workshop this Monday in order to gain a better understanding of what will be covered and how they can support their child.



On Friday 19th, the nursing team will be in school to measure the weight and height of the children in Reception and Year 6.

Wrapping Up Warm! It is so cold outside... and it is due to get even colder!

Breck Foundation

The Breck Foundation is a charity organisation that was founded in 2014 in response to the tragic loss of Breck Bednar, a 14-year-old boy who was groomed and murdered by someone he met online. Their work aims to prevent this from ever happening again. With 98% of young people now active internet users, current and future generations grow up having to navigate new and evolving digital dangers. Their priority is to help them develop the resilience and skills they need to live, play and thrive online in safety.

On 8th February, the foundation will deliver a powerful and compelling online safety presentation to Years 3-6, using Breck's story to educate everyone on the dangers that children and young people face online.

In addition, there will be a **parent workshop via Zoom on 7th February at 6pm**. More information about the Zoom workshop will be given in the next couple weeks but please put it in your diary. We hope to see as many parents as possible since our children's safety is extremely important to us all.
