Half Term Vouchers and Holiday Programme

We can now confirm that London Borough of Lewisham will use a further allocation of the 'Household Support Fund' to support families with FSM eligible children by providing vouchers for the half term. The available funding means Lewisham can assist these families at a rate of £15 per eligible child.

If you are eligible for the voucher, look out for further communication from your school and your £15 half term voucher.

Lewisham have made some changes to their Holiday Programme too. Please be advised that families who wish to access the upcoming MAY half term holiday activities programme will not a require code. Places are allocated on a first come first serve basis and are prioritised for children eligible for benefit related free school meals. Parents do not receive a code (vouchers will be used in the summer) and will need to contact providers directly to register and book on.

Local Consent Forms


