

## What has been happening this week?

Head lice CANNOT HOP, JUMP or FLY. They crawl from person-to-person POSING FOR A SELFIE or using A FRIEND'S HAIRBRUSH.



LICE EGGS - called nits are very HARD TO REMOVE by hand. Use a NIT COMB to SCRAPE them off the HAIR



Sometimes, LICE DON'T CAUSE SYMPTOMS FOR 4-6 WEEKS. The main symptom is ITCHING.



lice usually DIE AFTER 48 HOURS and NITS DIE A WEEK or two FOLLOWING REMOVAL.

Head lice DO NOT spread disease



Washing clothes and bedsheets in WATER HOTTER THAN 130 F will kill living lice and nits. Items that cannot be washed should be PLACED IN PLASTIC BAGS FOR TWO WEEKS.



Contrary to popula CANNOT BE SPREAD



Head lice CANNOT BE KILLED BY REGULAR SHAMPOO or frequen BATHING. TREATMENT of lice may TAKE TWO APPLICATIONS of a medicated shampoo applied 9 DAYS APART.

#### Head lice in school

Several cases of head lice have been reported in school recently. Over half term, please check and treat your child's hair to stop the lice spreading any further. Please keep checking your child's hair over the week to prevent any further cases. If you find any, you will need to treat the whole family.

Head lice can be treated using conditioner, tea tree oil or shop bought products with a fine-tooth comb.
