Free School Meal vouchers for Christmas Holiday

London Borough of Lewisham will use an allocation of the 'Household Support Fund (5)' to support families with FSM eligible children by providing vouchers for the holidays until Easter 2025 and in particular, the upcoming Christmas and New Year holidays. The available funding means Lewisham can assist families at a rate of £30 per eligible child for this holiday. The deadline is fast approaching for parents/carers to apply for a Reception place for September 2025 - **15th January 2025**.

How to apply

You need to apply online at www.eadmissions.org.uk. You can apply for up to six schools, either in Lewisham or outside the borough. You must not put independent schools on your application. You must list the schools you wish to apply for in preference order. You must apply by the closing date on **15 January 2025**. When you will find out which school your child has been offered a place at You will get an email on the evening of national offer day, **Wednesday 16 April 2025**. It will tell you where your child has been offered a place at Place and how to accept the offer.

Human Rights Day

On 10th December 1948, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly.

This important moment in human history is now remembered on that date every year and is known as Human Rights Day.

All children have the same human rights as adults. The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child sets out the additional rights that all children have until the age of 18.

Children's rights are human rights so we can celebrate them alongside the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Article 4 (implementation of the Convention)

Governments must do all they can to make sure every child can enjoy their rights by creating systems and passing laws that promote and protect children's rights.

Article 41 (respect for higher national standards)

If a country has laws and standards that go further than the present Convention, then the country must keep these laws.

Watch <u>this video</u> with your child at home about the history of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Discuss in why you think the rights mentioned are important and relevant to you and your family.
