It's also important to listen to your child and give them a chance to talk about what they're experiencing online, what apps and sites they use and who they're talking to.

Another great resource for families are the **Lego Build and Talk** <u>Activities.</u> Our story-style Build & Talk activities, created for children ages 6 to 9, support families with a playful way to engage in otherwise difficult conversations about digital safety topics while playing with LEGO® bricks. You'll also find handy discussion starters to get the conversation going as you Build & Talk together.

For older children, there are a bank of other resources and top tips with how to talk to them about keeping safe while using laptops, IPads or mobile phones - **NSPCC online resources.** 

Remember, children should not use the internet unsupervised and parents/carers must set **parental controls** on all devices. It is the adult's responsibility to keep children safe online.


