On Monday, our **Nursery, Reception and Year 1** children enjoyed a special Lunar New Year dance workshop, organised by Ms. Barlow.



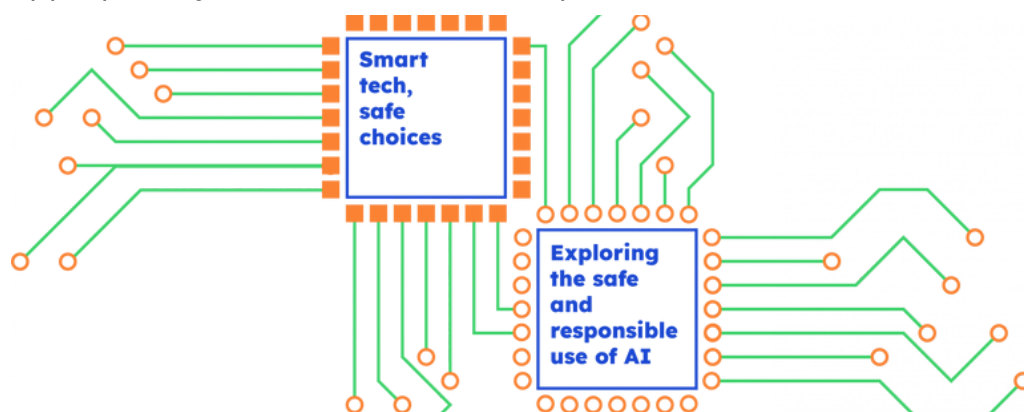

The assembly also provided an opportunity to explore the ongoing journey of the LGBTQ+ community in campaigning for equal rights and respect. Through this learning, the children were encouraged to better understand and value the diverse society we live in. By reflecting on the past, we can develop greater appreciation in the present and continue working towards a more inclusive future.

- Choose safe, age-appropriate content
- Ask a trusted adult if something feels wrong
- Do not share personal information online
- Stop and report harmful or upsetting content
- Use media to learn, have fun, and stay healthy.
