Good Attendance

At Brindishe Schools we know how important good attendance is for each child's learning and progress. We want to work with our families to achieve this. Good attendance is 96% or higher. You can check on your own child's attendance by logging into Arbor's Parent Portal using your unique login details.

You can help your child have good attendance by making sure they are in school every day in term time that they are well and by **not taking holiday during term time or adding on days to the start or end of a holiday period.**

- **Holidays:** there are already 13 weeks of the year given over to holidays and therefore a holiday taken during term time will not be authorised.
- Exceptional Circumstances: there may be occasions where, due to exceptional
 circumstances, you need to request a term time absence. To do this you must complete
 a request form in advance. Request forms are available from the school office. Our
 Attendance Policy details the kinds of circumstances for which we will consider
 authorising an absence during term time. Please ask Sue Murphy, our AWSO, for
 details.

 Medical Needs: some children with more serious medical conditions may need to attend appointments during the school day. These absences are always authorised and we keep copies of appointment letters on the child's file.
 Where possible we ask that you make routine doctor or dentist check-up appointments outside of school hours.

Should your child's attendance fall below 96% we will monitor any absences and will ask to meet with you should we not see any improvement. We also monitor patterns of absence, for example, where children are routinely absent on a Monday straight after a weekend.

If you have any questions regarding your child's attendance at school, please speak to me, to Sue Murphy (our AWSO) or to one of the Deputy Heads.

Developing our outdoor spaces at Brindishe Green

Following on from our successful 'Edible Garden' rebuild, I am delighted to let you know that we have secured enough funds to improve our Nursery garden, our rooftop MUGA and our trim trail. Over the half term break the Nursery and rooftop will be laid with new astroturf After half term, work will then begin on our trim trail, including laying a safe surface and building new equipment.

This is supported by the funds raised by our parents and carers through the BFG (Brindishe Friends Group) so thank you for all your contributions so far including over £1,000 at the Christmas Fair! Safeguarding – Asthma pumps and epipens

Asthma and anaphylaxis (serious allergic response) are both potentially life-threatening conditions requiring emergency medication to be available at all times. If your child needs an asthma pump or an epipen, we will need to put together a care plan for them, drawn up by our lead first-aider, Eleni Papastavrou, via the school office. All medication needs to be brought to the school office and not handed to classroom staff please. Please ask at the school office for more information.
