Dear parents, carers, staff, governors and friends at Brindishe Green,

Thank you to all the Nursery and Reception parents and carers who came along on Thursday to hear how to help their child with maths. The Early Years team led by Susan Jackson and Joan Cresswell shared lots of ideas and more information about early maths has been handed out to early years' parents and carers today.

Children across the school have taken part in a Lewisham Sumdog maths contest this week and Brindishe Green have done remarkably well. Mr Phipps our Maths Lead reports that, in the Overall Winners category, Banyan Class (Year 5) finished 2nd across Lewisham and were also named the Daily Winners for Sunday.

We had many other classes who finished in the Top 20: Palm, Bamboo, Magnolia, Lilac, Birch and Maple which, out of over 80 competitors, is a very promising start!

The importance of good attendance

Good attendance at Brindishe Green is 96%+. You can check your child's current attendance by logging into Arbor's Parent Portal at <https://brindishe-green.uk.arbor.sc>

Please note that if you take your child out of school during term time for a family holiday this absence will **always be unauthorised** and the absence noted in your child's school records.

Holidays taken in term time significantly impact a child's learning and their ability to feel included socially with their peer group.

Therefore only absences **for exceptional circumstances** can be considered by the school and examples of these are included in our Attendance Policy. Please ask for a copy at the school office.

If your child is absent from school on an unauthorised family holiday the school may ask the council to serve a Penalty Notice. This Penalty Notice is a fine of £60 (per child) which, if not paid within 21 days, rises to £120. If you are issued with a Penalty Notice and you fail to pay it within 28 days you will be prosecuted in court.

Good progress and achievement go hand in hand with good attendance and punctuality. Thank you to everyone who helps us to make this possible for their child.

Young Climate Warriors

This week Magnolia Class shared their learning in assembly about how plastics dumped in the worlds' oceans are damaging our sea life. They talked about how we can each make a small change to how we live our lives (for example recycling the things we might throw away) and how this can contribute to a much larger world-wide change to help our planet survive. Magnolia class also reminded us about Young Climate Warriors. They have great ideas each week for how to make these small differences and here is this week's below:

This week's challenge
7th February

Remember to Hit the RED BUTTON - CHALLENGE COMPLETED!

Nude food?! REFUSE snack-packaging
ALL snack-packaging - plastic, paper, foil, creates carbon emissions when it's made, transported, recycled or landfilled.
Keep and re-use plastic pots of all shapes and sizes.
Go for NUDE FOOD for your pack lunch / snack.
Cut up seasonal fruit and veg? grated cheese? dried fruit?
Buy a large packet of biscuits or crisps - and divide it up?
Bake your own snacks and share with friends?

Plastic typically uses less land, less water, and less energy to manufacture than alternatives - and therefore results in less carbon emissions. To combat climate change we need to have less packaging rather than alternatives.

In the UK, we eat 6 billion packets of crisps and 12.5 billion bars of chocolate a year - think of all that packaging - think of all those carbon emissions?!

Nude food is best for helping to tackle climate change - but if you sometimes eat crisps and chocolate remember to recycle their wrappers - 80% of the UK are within 4 miles of their nearest crisp recycling point - have you found yours yet? - <https://www.walkers.co.uk/recycle>.
