Dear parents, carers, staff, governors and friends at Brindishe Green,

### **IMPORTANT REMINDER General Election December 12 – Nursery classes closed for one day**

As you know Brindishe Green is being used as a polling station for the General Election on Thursday 12 December. The polling station will be set up in the nursery classroom, with access via the staff car park on Ardmere Cottages, **not** via the main entrance to the school on Beacon Road.



**Nursery will be closed to children for the day but the main school will be open for children in year R to 6. Children in these classes should come to school as usual on Polling Day.**

We will ensure that the general public (voters) are **ONLY** able to access the nursery classroom. There will be no access for the general public (voters) to any part of the school, dining hall, playgrounds, classrooms, toilets or entrances whilst the school is open and children are on site. The nursery area (polling station) and the entrance to and from it will be fenced off and secure and there will be **no access** into any other area of the school either externally or internally.

Our staff will be supervising the area throughout the school day and officers from the Electoral Commission will organise supervision and security at the polling station itself.

### **The past few weeks at Brindishe Green The BFG Christmas Fair**

We had an amazing turnout for our first Christmas Fair run by our new Brindishe Friends Group last Friday.

Huge thanks go in particular to our co-Chairs, Dana Bradley and Izzy Warren and the BFG committee who helped plan, co-ordinate and run the fair, as well as to all the parents and carers who gave up their time on the day to help set up, run a stall or clear away. We are very lucky to have such a supportive community at Brindishe Green and look forward to future events.

## Visits and visitors

KS2 choir went to sing at Merbury Court, a local home for the elderly last week. ### **Road safety around our school**

You may be aware that Lewisham is launching a Healthy Neighbourhoods Programme. The aim of the programme is to make Lewisham communities 'greener, healthier, and more attractive places to live, work, play and do business'. One key priority is to reduce traffic in the borough, through a number of traffic management measures including road closures. There is due to be a 6-month trial starting in January 2020 within an area to the west of Hither Green station (this does not include Beacon Road). This will include blocking off Ennersdale Road at the railway bridge and so it will not be possible to turn right onto Ennersdale Road from Nightingale Grove. Vehicles would need to drive via Lewisham or the South Circular to get to the other side of the station. You can find more information, including the map of the trial area, here:

At Brindishe Green, we have not been consulted about this scheme, and have only recently found out about the trial. Although we support measures taken to reduce traffic and improve air quality, we are concerned about what the impact will be on the roads local to our school, particularly Beacon Road. We plan to invite local councillors into school to discuss the proposal and the implications it may have for Brindishe Green.
