'Meet the Teacher'

This half term, we are inviting parents and carers of children in Years 1 to 6 to make an appointment for an individual meeting with their child's class teacher. This 'meet the teacher' meeting is a chance for us get to know each other better and to help teachers find out more about your child and their interests, strengths and needs. Packed Lunches

Please can we remind all our families that we **endeavour** to be a nut free school. We ask that as a school community, we do all we can to ensure that nuts and nut products (such as hazelnut chocolate spreads) are not brought into school in packed lunches, book bags and as an after school snack.

All children from Years 1-6 must leave their packed lunches on the trolleys outside first thing in the morning and collect them from the trolleys at the end of the school day.

Please can we remind all our parents/carers and children that the main front door should only be used if you need to speak to a member of staff, to leave a payment in the collection box or if your child is late for school. Moving on after Year 6

As we start our new academic year at Brindishe Green, we send our best wishes and good luck to our old Year 6 classes who have now started their new secondary schools. Our children have moved on to 33 different schools in total, some with a group of friends and some on their own. Below is a list of the schools they are now attending, alongside the number of children who have gone there. Most of our children went to a school in Lewisham (59 out of 87), but there are also a number who are further away, either because it is close to where they now live or because they sat an additional entrance exam. Different schools have different admissions criteria and parents/carers carefully consider this when choosing a school for their child. Schools and boroughs take into consideration if a child is in care, has a medical or special educational need, has a sibling/s, and the distance between the home and school when allocating a child their new school. Some schools also require the children to sit an entrance exam, but this is not the case for Lewisham secondary schools.
