Dear parents, carers, staff, governors and friends,

Welcome back from half term to all our children. Despite the rather chilly start, we are pleased to let you know that the children have settled back quickly and wonderful learning has already taken place across all the year groups.

This week we had our first whole school Invacuation of the year, which ran very smoothly. All the children were very calm and mature while they quietly waited under their table until they were told they could come out – well done children. Year 4 also took part in some exciting cricket sessions with coaches from Platform Cricket.

We will hold a short virtual assembly and a one-minute silence on Wednesday at school. We will also continue to sell red poppies in the playground early next week (mornings only). Money collected goes straight to The Royal British Legion.



Warm Layers

The weather has got noticeably colder this week and it is very important that all the children come to school wearing layers and a warm coat. If the weather is dry, the children still go out to play or to do PE, no matter how cold it is. Please make sure these clothes are clearly labelled so that we can make sure they stay with their owners.

Also, following key government guidance, classrooms need to well-ventilated. **Windows and doors will remain open** to maximise ventilation therefore it is very important that the children, and staff, come to school wearing layers, including a warm jumper/hoodie/fleece. Please make sure these are clearly labelled with your child's name.

Online Safety Bulletin

TikTok - The minimum age rating for a child to use TikTok is 13. TikTok allows users to watch, create and share videos, often to a soundtrack of the top tracks, right from your phone. When you sign up for TikTok, your account is **public**. This means anyone can see your videos, share them, send you private messages and use your location information. TikTok does have a 'family Safety Mode', but you should make your information private, so only contacts you know can see your videos. However, when sharing off the app (such as via Whatsapp) videos can then be forwarded without your consent.
