## Our Weekly online safety message from Ms Chin.....

**TikTok: The minimum age rating for a child to use TikTok is 13.**



TikTok allows users to watch, create and share videos, often to a soundtrack of the top tracks, right from your phone. It currently has over 100million users. When you sign up for TikTok, your account is **public**.

**This means anyone can see your videos, share them, send you private messages and use your location information.**

**TikTok does have a 'family Safety Mode', but** you should make your information private, so only contacts you know can see your videos. However, when sharing off the app (such as via Whatsapp) videos can then be forwarded without your consent.

## Online Safety Parent/Carer Tech Workshops

The purpose of the workshops is to increase awareness and provide some useful skills to support parents. By the end of the workshops, parents/carers will be able to:

- ✓ Recognise how modern technology can be used to jeopardise young people's safety
- ✓ Distinguish between different types of technological abuse that could affect children and young people
- ✓ Assess the risk factors involved in cases where technology is being used to abuse children and young people
- ✓ List different ways in which you can empower your children to use technology safely and positively

The Covid pandemic has brought home the realities of globalisation and how inter-connected we are. The virus's invisibility has made it all the more frightening. Palm oil is an invisible ingredient in many processed foods and household products, yet the consequence of the unsustainable management of palm oil plantations is devastating for climate change and biodiversity. Rather than seeing these big, invisible issues as overwhelming children are encouraged to take a leaf from Nelson Mandela – making small daily changes can help make our world a better place.

This week's challenge encourages Young Climate Warriors to learn about palm oil, and 'sustainable palm oil', and to make and enjoy some home-made biscuits instead of factory-manufactured ones containing palm oil.

### Year 4 Multiplication Times Table Check (MTC)

Across next week, Year 4 will be taking part in the pilot MTC scheme, which will become statutory from 2022. The children will have to answer 25 times table questions on an I-Pad with a time limit of six seconds for each question. It is very similar to what they have practiced a lot throughout Year 4 and is a chance for the children to show off just how well they know their times tables!

### Partridge Update from Miss Supple (Science Lead)

It has been great to see the excitement from the children (and staff) whenever they see our 10 grey partridge chicks. They have spent their week visiting different year groups to allow the children to get a better look at them and over this week they have already begun to lose their soft downy feathers. It has been fantastic to hear the children asking questions about whether the difference in feather colour was related to whether they were male or female - apparently this is not the case and it is just luck of the draw as to what colour feathers they get.


We have learnt that grey partridge hens lay a lot of eggs. Females can lay up to 22 eggs—among the most of any bird species. They are strictly a ground bird - never likely to be found in pear trees - much to some children disappointment! They have now gone back to the farm where they will stay until the autumn. They will be relocated to their release site so they can go on to live and reproduce naturally. This whole experience has allowed us to help this common native bird, which is now on the Birds of Conservation Concern 'red list', to become less endangered.

## COVID UPDATES

Restrictions are lifting, but specific guidance remains in place. Please take time to read the following information to ensure we keep ourselves, our school and our community as safe as we can....

### HANDS, FACE, SPACE

This message is still a key part of our life.

**HANDS:** We will, once again, be reminding the children of following good hand hygiene, by washing their hands regularly. Please encourage your children to do the same at home.

**FACE:** Our expectations remain in place. We still encourage face coverings as you enter the school grounds.

**SPACE:** Maintaining a distance of at least 1m between us where possible will help reduce risk for all.

### Current rulings in place

- You can now meet up outside in larger groups, up to a limit of 30 people
- You can now meet indoors as a group of up to six people or two households
- Indoor hospitality can reopen
- Hotels and all holiday overnight accommodation can reopen
- You may also go on holiday or travel abroad, following government guidelines

### Travelling

If you or any member of your household are travelling outside of the UK to either a RED, AMBER or GREEN country, you must inform the school ([info@brindishegreen.lewisham.sch.uk](mailto:info@brindishegreen.lewisham.sch.uk)) so we can ensure that you and your family are clear about the procedures and restrictions that may need to be followed. We will ask you to let us know the following information:

- Where you or your household member are going
- The return date to the UK
- Who is in your household

**Covid Symptoms** – If you, your child or a member of your household becomes ill with Covid-19 symptoms or receives a positive test result for COVID-19, please email [info@brindishegreen.lewisham.sch.uk](mailto:info@brindishegreen.lewisham.sch.uk) immediately providing the person/child's name, class, date, and the type and date of test. Your whole household must self-isolate for 10 days. **Please let the school know straight away of your child's test results.**

### Continuing to keep Brindishe Green Safe and Our Children at School

We ask that all families support us in keeping the children, staff and community safe:

- Please wear a face covering/mask when on school premises, if possible
- **Please try to cross to the far side of Beacon Road once you have collected your child, rather than walk in front of the gate where parents are standing and waiting to enter the school.**
